Planets, as you know, and out moon, too, shine only by light reflected from the sun and planets shine with a steady light while stars appear to twinkle. This is caused by substances in the air between the star and the earth. The unsteady air bends the light from the star, and then it seems to twinkle.

Why does our sun shine? Because it is a star and not a very big or bright star at that. Compare to all the other stars in the sky, it might be considered medium-sized and medium-bright. There are millions of stars that are smaller than our sun and many stars are several hundred times larger than the sun. They look small only because they are so far away. Ever since the days of the Greek astronomers, some 2000 years ago, the stars have been divided into classes according to their 'magnitude', or brightness. Another way of grouping stars is according to their spectra or the kind of light that comes from the stars.
