Long long ago people didn't have rulers to measure things with as we do now. They didn't measure things in inches and centimeters. Instead, they used the parts of the body as units of measurement. They measured something by seeing how many hands long it was or they saw how many fingers thick it was. Another unit of measurement was the length of the forearm, i.e., from the elbow to the tip of the middle finger. Yet another unit of measurement was the length of the foot from the heel to the big toe. Perhaps that is where the unit of measurement—the foot comes from.

There was one problem with the way the people used to measure things, with their arms, hands and feet. Some people have long arms, big feet and wide hands while others have short arms, small feet and narrow hands. This caused a lot of confusion. Afterall what is one hand long for you cannot be one hand long for your father. So people soon realized that a measurement such as the foot had to be the same all the time. In other words, standard units of measurement or fixed units of measurement for measuring weight, height and length were needed. That is why the units of measurement we use today are based on certain standards. A foot now means exactly the same length (12 inches) for everyone, whatever be the size of their own foot may be.

Statue of Liberty is a colossal sculpture on Liberty Island in New York harbour in the United States. The statue, designed by Frederic Auguste Bartholdi, a French sculptor and dedicated on October 28, 1886 was a gift to the United States from the People of France.

The statue is a robed female figure representing Libertas, the Roman Goddess of Freedom, who bears a torch and a tablet upon which is inscribed the date of American Declaration of Independence July 4, 1776. A broken chain lies at her feet. The statue measures 151 feet one inch from base to torch and 305 feet one inch from ground to torch.

The statue is an icon of freedom and of the United States, a welcoming signal to immigrants arriving from abroad.

The statue was constructed in France, shipped overseas in crates and assembled on a completed pedestal on what was then called Bedleo's Island. The statue's completion was marked by a parade and dedication ceremony was presided over by the President Grover Cleveland.

Bartholdi studied Architecture in Paris and also served as a Squadron Leader in French-Prussian War in 1870.

So after the establishment of French Republic, the project of building some suitable memorial to show the friendly feeling existing between the Republic of the United States and France was suggested and the French-American Union was established by Edward Laboulay. Bartholdi joined this group and planned to build this monument.
