Using stories in the classroom is fun, but the activity should not be considered trivial or frivolous. Indeed there is a strong support for storytelling in teaching. Cortazzi (1994) points out that storytelling is fundamental to education and specifically to language teaching. Zips (1995) and Morgan and Rinvolucri (1992) find stories a basic part of the whole language approach to learning, reaching the

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whole person and appealing to the subconscious. According to Brunfir and Johnson (1979) reading or telling stories in class is a natural way to learn a new language.

A river usually drains a vast area, or "watershed" and it is the heavy flow of water from anywhere in this watershed that makes a river rise and flood over its banks. Some floods are very helpful. The Nile, ever since man's first written history, has been bringing a life-giving flood every year to farmlands, by carrying down soils from the highlands. Primitive men deliberately settled in the path of floods — because they were so fertile. Unlike the Nile the Yellow River in China has brought destruction periodically. In 1935, it made 40,00,000 people homeless by flooding over. We can control floods by building dikes or levees. A second way is to have emergency channels. A third way is to develop reservoirs.
