13. Summarize the following passage :


Human problems are not simple, they are very complex. To understand them requires patience and insight, and it is of the highest importance that we, as individuals, understand and resolve them for ourselves. They are not to be understood and resolved only when we are aware of ourselves as a total process, that is, when we understand our whole psychological make-up; and no religious or political leader can give us the key to that understanding. To understand ourselves, we must be aware of our relationship, not only with people, but also with property, with ideas and with nature. If we are to bring about a true revolution in human relationship, which is the basis of all society, there must be a fundamental change in our own values and outlook; but we avoid the necessary and fundamental transformation of ourselves, and try to bring about political revolutions in the world, which always lead to bloodshed and disaster.

The latter of them generally changes the name of labour for that of exercise, but differs only from ordinary labour as it rises from another motive. I consider the body as a system of tubes and glands, or to use a more rustic phrase, a bundle of pipes and strainers, fitted to one another after so wonderful a manner as to make a proper engine for the soul to work with. This description does not only comprehend the bowels, bones, tendons, veins, nerves, and arteries, but every muscle and every ligature, which is a composition of fibres, that are so many imperceptible tubes or pipes interwoven on all sides with invisible glands or strainers.

You wouldn't chuck an empty coconut shell anywhere other than the garbage pile on the beaches in Australia and New Zealand. Why don't you spit paan on the streets of Tokyo? Why don't you use examination jockeys or buy fake certificates in Boston? You can respect and conform to a foreign system in other countries but cannot in your own. Why can't you be the same here in India? We go to

the pools to choose a government and after that forfeit all responsibility. We sit back waiting to be pampered and expect the government to do everything whilst our contribution is totally negative. We expect the government to clean up but we are not going to stop chucking garbage all over the place nor are we going to stop to pick up a stray piece of paper and throw it in the dust bin. We expect the railways to provide clean bathrooms but we are not going to learn the proper use of bathrooms. We want Indian Airlines and Air India to provide the best of food and toiletries but we are not going to stop pilfering at the least opportunity. This applies even to the staff that is known not to pass on the service to the public. When it comes to burning social issues like women, dowry, girl child and others we make loud drawing room protestations and continue to do the reverse at home. Our excuse? "It's the whole system which has to change, how will it matter if I alone forego my son's right to a dowry." So who's going to change the system? What does a system consist of? Very conveniently for UK it consists of our neighbours, other households, other cities, other communities and the government. But definitely not me and you. When it comes to us actually making a positive contribution to the system we lock ourselves along with our families into a safe cocoon and look into the distance at countries far away and wait for a Mr. Clean to come along and work miracles for us with a majestic sweep of his hand."
