Chemistry had its beginnings in very ancient times. In studying the great river valley civilizations, scholars have found evidence to show that the processes of Chemistry were known to the people of ancient times. The ancient Egyptians, Hindus and the Chinese were interested in the preparation of medicines and perfumes, and in metal work and pottery. These activities required the application of their knowledge of Chemistry.

Chemistry during the Middle Ages was not a pursuit of knowledge for its own sake. Its aims were more practical. There was a belief among the people that 'base metals' like lead and copper could be converted into the noble metal, gold. The 'philosopher's stone' was supposed to have the power to bring about this change. The people who sought this magic substance and conducted experiments with various substances were the alchemists. Another magic substance that the alchemists sought was 'the elixir of life', which could cure all diseases and make people live long. The alchemists failed in their search for these two magic formulae, but their experiments yielded a large body of knowledge regarding substances.

18. Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow :

When Mr. and Mrs. Gaekwad went home last night after a late film show, they found that burglars had broken into their house and had taken all their silver, their steel utensils, radio, tape-recorder and a box in which Mrs. Gaekwad had kept her silk saris. When the police came, they found that the men had forced open the door of the kitchen. The Alsatian dog of the Gaekwads had apparently been given drugged meat; it was still drowsy at six in the morning. Mrs. Gaekwad estimated that she had lost thirty saris worth about ₹ 3,800. The radio, an expensive foreign one, was a wedding present from Mr. Gaekwad's parents; the stainless steel utensils

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have been valued at ₹ 750. A police dog was taken to the house and it led the police to a hut in a slum area three miles away. But the hut was empty, though there were signs that it had recently been occupied. Investigation is continuing.
