There has been a continuous growth in the number of vehicles all over the world. Millions of vehicles ply the world's roads, and everyday the number goes up. In fact, the growth of these vehicles has consistently outpaced that of the human population. About half of the world's oil is consumed by a fleet of 500 million vehicles. These vehicles account for most of the energy used in the carriage of people and freight. Since 1970 the annual increase in the number of cars has averaged 4.7 percent, whereas the annual increase in the number of buses and trucks has averaged 5.1 percent. As per a rough estimate, a billion vehicles will ply the world's roads by the year 2030 it this increasing trend continues. Such rapid growth poses many problems. It would be very difficult to handle some of these problems, which might led to serve oil crises in all parts of the world, particularly in developing and underdeveloped countries. In the long run, it causes consumption to rise faster than oil production, resulting in the squeezing of oil supplies. Indeed, the ongoing rise in oil prices appears to be putting an end to the buyer's market, which emerged in the early 1980's [when an economic shutdown and conservation efforts temporarily reduced world demand].
