A fuel is a material that is burned in order to get heat and light, and also to generate power. The process of burning, or combustion, is a chemical reaction. A material combines with oxygen from the air and gives off energy. The energy is released in the form of heat and light. Fuels can be classified as solid or gaseous or they can be classified according to their origin - natural, chemical or metal based.

Wood was one of the first fuels used by man, and was his most important one for many centuries. But during the sixteenth century, wood started to become scarce in Europe, and coal began to replace it. Coal itself is made of the remains of ancient trees and plants that grew in swampy jungles in warm, moist climates hundreds of millions of years ago. These trees and plants fell into the swamp waters. Bacteria changed some parts of wood into gases that escaped, leaving behind a black mixture, mostly carbon. In time the pressure from mud and sand above squeezes out most of the liquid, leaving behind a pasty mass that slowly hardened into coal.

Plantation agriculture is the cultivation of a particular plant or crop over a large area for commercial purposes. Cultivation, harvesting and processing is carried out in a systematic way, much as in a factory. Fruit orchards and plantations of spices also fall under this type of agriculture. Shifting agriculture or jhum farming is still practiced by tribals in north-eastern India
