Founded by Muralidhar Devidas 'Baba' Amte in a place hundred kilometers from Nagpur, Anandwan has enabled leprosy patients and other outcastes of Indian society to live productive, fulfilling lives. It was started in 1951 and today the 5000-strong model community, spread over 190 hectares, has farms, small-scale industrial units, man-made lakes stocked with fish, hospitals, colleges, and school for the blind.

Three generations of Amtes are involved in this large community project. Baba Amte's elder son, Vikas, heads Anandwan. His wife, Bharati, a pediatrician, works at the community hospital. Baba's younger son, Prakash, and his wife, Mandakini, live in the forests of Hemalkasa, 250 kms form Anandwan, and run a hospital and a school for tribals, as well for animals. Baba and Sadhana Amte's two adopted daughters, Renuka and Bijli, are teachers. As for the grandchildren, Prakash's sons Digant and Aniket, and their wives, work at Hemalkasa. Vikas' son, Kaustubh, a chartered accountant,

helps run Anandwan, while daughter, Sheetal, a fresh MBBS graduate, has just joined them.

The first season my crop was good enough to satisfy me, especially the beans and potatoes. The next year I did better still, for I dug all the land I needed, about a third of an acre, with a spade. I learned from the experience of both years that if one would live simply and eat only the crop which he raised, and raise no more than he ate, then he would need to plant only a small piece of ground.

Ancient poetry and old stories suggest that farming was once a holy art, but people farm today with unholy haste and thoughtlessness. Out purpose now is merely to have large farms and large crops.
